### **Application Process:**

Please submit your completed application with signed agreements and <u>required documents</u> listed below to: Elizabeth Lopez at The Potter's House, 810 VanRaalte Dr SW, Grand Rapids, MI or scan to <u>elopez@tphgr.org</u>.

- Required document copies:
  - Your student's High School Transcripts from all high schools attended (or if incoming 9th Grader, 2 years of Middle School Report Cards), and a copy of the most recent achievement test scores.
  - Your student's certified birth certificate or passport.
  - o All special education (I.E.P.) evaluations i.e. speech, ADD, ADHD, learning disabilities, and/or emotional impairment.
  - o Completed student questionnaire (must be filled out by the student).
  - Two letters of recommendation. The letters should describe the student as a learner and why he or she would benefit from attending The Potter's House High School. One letter must come from a former teacher who has worked directly with your student, and the other from an adult who is not a blood relative of the student.

After submitting a complete application with all required documents, the high school office will contact you to schedule an interview. We want to make this experience the best possible for you and your child. Please feel free to call me if you have any questions about the enrollment process.

## THE POTTER'S HOUSE PHILOSOPHY STATEMENT AGREEMENT

The Potter's House is an innovative Christian school in a multi-cultural urban setting. The school is non-denominational and evangelical in nature; our main purpose is to provide solid Christian education for a broad range of children who might not normally have the opportunity to attend a Christian school. In order to insure a broad social and cultural range within the student body, tuition is based on a percentage of the parental income rather than on a fixed rate.

The Potter's House offers Christ-centered education. Since God is the center of reality, the Bible will be taught as having significance in all areas of life. Christian discipleship and decision-making will be emphasized. The basics will be taught with sensitivity given to each child's learning rate and interests.

Through personalized education using a rich language experience for language arts, The Potter's House seeks to make education meaningful and exciting for all students. The needs and unique talents of each child will be underscored in the curriculum. Since present information is multiplying at fantastic rates, The Potter's House does not seek to pump isolated facts into students' minds. The goal is rather to produce children that know how to use information to think critically and make wise decisions. The Potter's House seeks to develop students that love to learn and will continue to learn on their own throughout their lives.

The Potter's House considers the first 4-6 weeks of school a probationary time for new students. During this time administration will monitor the student's progress (academic effort and social behavior) to confirm proper placement. If it is determined that a different placement is more suitable, the administration will advise parents and make the necessary adjustments. The Potter's House administration will determine final placement.

# The Potter's House High School Academic Probation Agreement

Academic Probation occurs when a student's GPA falls below a 1.7 (C-). Steps will be taken to help the student get back on track, and eligibility may be reinstated as soon as the student has fulfilled their academic requirements. The student must then fulfill all of the Academic Probation Requirements or face the possibility of being asked to leave The Potter's House School.

### **Academic Probation Requirements**

- 1. The student **must attain a grade point average of 1.7** or better in the quarter.
- 2. If a student's GPA is below a 1.7 (C-) on their report card, a conference will be called with parents and school staff and a specific learning plan will be put in place.
- 3. The proactive plan set in motion to help and support a student will include the following:
  - a. Grade checks/progress reports will be done every **2** weeks for students and should be sent to the student's advisor, teachers, and parents.
  - b. The student will be required to participate in two of the teacher supervised times per week in order to work on homework and to get help from teachers with areas in which he/she is exhibiting poor performance.
  - c. The student must get teacher signatures on the Academic Probation Contact Log and return them to their advisor each week.
  - d. Times for teacher contact for support are:
    - i. Zero hour Monday-Friday, 7:15 7:50 a.m. in the Cafeteria.
    - ii. 8th hour Monday-Thursday, 3:35 4:30 p.m. in the Cafeteria.
    - iii. Advisory Intervention Tuesday and Thursday, 11:49 a.m.-12:18 p.m. in various rooms.
- 4. Additional organizational help, coaching, and accountability checks may be part of a particular student's program for academic success as well.
- 5. The process for Academic Probation due to grades includes the current advocacy/dismissal process that is available upon request.
